Tour de Cragg Challenge!

Events planned to celebrate this year's Tour de France

Plans are well advanced for the celebration of this year's Tour de France in anticipation of next year when the event will come to Cragg Vale!

3 events are planned for the opening 2 weekends of this year's Tour de France in Corsica.

- The first is a 100 km road bike ride from Don Valley stadium, Sheffield to the Robin Hood pub in Cragg Vale on the 29th June. This is actually the 2nd half of next year's Stage 2 of the Tour de France in reverse and an opportunity for amateur riders to get a taste of what the professionals will face.
- The second event is on the following day, 30th June, and involves a Round-Robin off-road ride from the Robin Hood pub in Cragg Vale to the Robin Hood pub in Peckett Well and back again - a distance of 45km over some challenging terrain.

Both the Robin Hood pubs in Cragg Vale and Peckett Well are on the route that the Tour de France will take next year and we thought it was an excellent opportunity to do some 'twinning' events between the two pubs that share not only a name but are very much at the heart of their two valley communities. Both these events are for more serious riders and require participants to register with the organisers beforehand. Registration forms are available at the Robin Hood pub Cragg Vale and by email to Craggvale2014@gmail.com.

• The 3rd event on the 7th July is a more light-hearted affair celebrating the fact that 12 months later will see the whole



hullaballoo of the Tour de France pass through Cragg Vale. It is a fancy dress Round-Robin walk with a French theme and is open to everyone. The French Fancy dress theme opens up a whole host of interesting possibilities, from straightforward beret and stripy jumper to the more adventurous, such as Napoleon!

Starting at the Robin Hood pub Cragg Vale, participants (hopefully in fancy dress) will walk to Hebden Bridge where they will catch a bus to the Robin Hood pub Peckett Well. The reason for this is the long stretch of road above Hardcastle Craggs which makes it difficult to walk in a large group (though the bridleway is available for those hardier folk who want to do the whole challenge on foot). After a sustaining beverage or two the route will be reversed and the group will return to Cragg Vale. We have kept details flexible enough that people can join at any point along the route or even do it the other way round if they wish. The main points of the day are to raise awareness of the Tour de France coming to our little part of the world and to have fun!

The arrival of the Tour de France in Cragg Vale next year will bring an unprecedented focus to the valley and over the next 12 months we hope to have a whole range of events that will celebrate and anticipate Le Tour.





The current World Record for the longest continuous stretch of bunting is held by Torpoint Town Council. It was set in June 2012 and it was 2.93 miles - made for the Jubilee. That's about 19,650 flags.

That's a lot of flags - at least 20,000 and probably more because the goal posts may have moved by then!!!



<u>Quarterly Recipe – Chicken</u> <u>Yum Sticks</u>

Ingredients

- 2/3 cup or 165g of plain lowfat yogurt
- 2 tsp. brown sugar
- 2 tsp. hot sauce (lots on the market choose your favourite), plus extra to eat with the chicken
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 8 chicken breasts
- Lemon wedges (optional)

<u>Method:</u>

- Combine a few tablespoons of the yogurt with the brown sugar in a medium-sized bowl and mix until well blended.
- Add the remaining yogurt, hot sauce, cumin, garlic and salt.
- Cut each chicken breast half into 6 to 8 equal pieces.
- Add to the yogurt mixture and stir until well combined.
- Thread the chicken onto eight skewers. Place in a large casserole dish so that the marinade is covering the skewers.
- Chill for 30 minutes to 2 hours.
- Grill the kebobs over medium heat, rotating sides every few minutes, until cooked through, about 10 to 14 minutes total.

Serve with extra hot sauce and lemon wedges. Serves 6 to 8.

Broadhead Clough - June update

The slow start to Spring continued. Our



March workday was cancelled but in May we finally completed the repair of the final eight steps. We hope the stronger railway sleepers are going to withstand more use from many feet, and last for a few years! April was the right time for strimming rush and the cold winter had slowed growth down so we were able to blitz much more of it. With a team of six we have managed to strim and rake off all the dead reeds out of the central area in the top meadow closest to the heath habitat. With less grazing this year the bilberry is recovering well and now in flower.

It is only in the last couple of weeks that the bluebells have appeared, their flowers opening to release that delicate but unmistakable scent. However, a few weeks ago the strong wind carried smoke from the burning moorland around Cragg Rd and the A58 into the wood. The airborne threat felt very real, even though it was under control and a long way away from the reserve. The birds weren't singing: instead the wood was filled with the noise of alarm calls as if they were all on edge. Since the fire I've seen a pair of hares around the reserve and wonder if they have been displaced from their usual habitat.

Having this fire follow so soon after the blaze in 2011 is another real blow and not just for the twite our "at risk" Pennine finch. The South Pennines Fire Operations Group (FOG) has been formed from representatives from the fire services of Greater Manchester, Lancashire and West Yorkshire; the six South Pennines local authorities and Natural England and the landowners, Yorkshire Water and United Utilities, as well as private estates. FOG's spokesman said "The negative impact of wildfires across the moors is widely recognised, including the economic impact on farmers through the loss of grazing and the loss of habitat...but in addition we want to highlight the hidden dangers; the pollution, the release of carbon into the atmosphere, and the impact on people's health." The damage done affects people too.



The YWT has long recognised that wildlife and people's interests can go together. Its charitable objectives and activities are summed up as "Yorkshire Wildlife Trust works for a Yorkshire rich in wildlife, valued and enjoyed by people." During 2013 the trust is restructuring into more locally based teams to inspire, educate and encourage more local communities. We will be linked to the management team at Stirley Farm in Huddersfield, where wildlife, education and farming activities go hand in hand. It has also updated its website for all reserves to include other reasons for a family day visit. Our page now includes social history with The Coiners and the B6138 long climb for cyclists. 








In the last month, things have started to move ahead with the Church. Firstly we heard that the Diocese has approved our plans for the re-ordering of the Church. This means that we can completely re vamp the interior of the



Church, removing the organ and the pews and liberating a considerable amount of space that will allow us to do everything that was done in the Sunday School, which is now the Steiner School, but with more capacity and total disabled access. We are at present finalising arrangements before putting the contract out to tender.

She is Cathy Reardon, who is at present a Curate in Huddersfield, and will be moving into the Vicarage in Mytholmroyd and taking up the post in late July.
