

Fibre Broadband comes to Cragg Vale

As part of the Superfast West Yorkshire programme, BT has upgraded the network in Cragg Vale making faster internet available to most properties, and with some shopping around it shouldn't cost much more than standard broadband.

An example speed increase which has been achieved is from 3MB on standard broadband to 20MB with fibre.

To see if fibre is available to you go to the Openreach website and type in your post code and phone number.

If it is available there are a number of providers apart from BT that can provide the service, shown on the Openreach website and elsewhere.





Broadhead Clough June 2018 update

As I write our county is gearing up for the fourth Tour de Yorkshire cycle race. We're so used to seeing cyclists tackling the longest continuous incline almost every day we forget the impact on those villages whose local hill is now a "climb" or "sprint" stage. The surprise of seeing the place through the fresh eyes of a tourist brings a new perspective and what we walk past every day without noticing is suddenly a "feature" to be celebrated and photographed.

I was reminded of this leading a guided tour for new volunteers, pointing out the challenges the YWT faces in managing the reserve. Here we cut back scrub and created a log pile for an "insect hotel". Where a rotting tree needed felling, there is now a clearing in which bluebells grow. Opening up drainage channels keeps the path dry but lower down we need to slow the flow to prevent soil erosion. One commented that even though she regularly runs through similar woodland, she never thinks who manages it for her to enjoy the experience. She just knows it's a great place to be! That's exactly how we want visitors to feel about Broadhead Clough. The volunteers come for many reasons and enjoy each task-day as an activity in itself, but most come to give something back: enhancing the environment for others to enjoy.


This summer there have been noticeably more visitors to the reserve tempted by the publication of a new book about the Coiners – "The Gallows Pole" and an accompanying walkers' map with a route showing the sites mentioned in the text. The Yorkshire Post has also featured Cragg Vale as a "Weekend Walk." Don't be left out. Come and visit the reserve with the eyes of a tourist to fully appreciate your local natural history and heritage. Take the track at Dauber Bridge (signboard 6 of the local history trail) and keep left until you reach the reserve.

Task-days are planned on the first Friday of the month at 10a.m. on June 1st, July 6th, Aug 3rd and Sep 7th. All tools are provided, and gloves if required. – bring a drink and packed lunch if you are staying all day.

Love Yorkshire, Love Wildlife



Passers-by may have seen 'Cragg Vale Pattern Company' on a door by the old co-op building but how many know its history? The engineering industry like the textile industry that once thrived around our valley, is disappearing fast. One local person, Brierley Hellowell, knows its story well.

A 'pattern' was a wooden form made first to be cast in sand and then in liquid metal. Brierley liked making wooden models, so when he was 16 his father suggested he should become an apprentice pattern-maker. After a five years apprenticeship for Asquith's in Halifax, one of the biggest foundries, he was 'called up' for 2 years national service in the RAF, where his pay of 28 shillings a week was better than that of an apprentice!

Afterwards, 23 years old and fully qualified, he decided to move from Asquith's. He wanted something more creative and skilled which he found first in Mitchell and Jenkinson in Halifax, then in a pattern shop in Brighouse, then Dyson's in Sowerby Bridge and then with Warman's.

However, his life wasn't all work and pattern making. A keen cyclist, he met his wife Hazel through a shared love of cycling and travel. He took a month off work with her to travel round Europe and then 5 ½ months off from Warman's to travel to India with her in an old jeep bought for £35! Brierley said they travelled via Afghanistan and the Khyber Pass but when they got to the India/Pakistan border it was being bombed and they had to come back through Iraq and Egypt but had no problems anywhere.

On his return, Brierley worked for several other engineering companies and then, in 1966 with his wife's brother Gerald

Whitehead, he bought the Cragg Vale Working Men's Club which had been standing empty and created the Cragg Vale Pattern Company. Work came in from many different places but much came from a steel foundry in Leeds. Most of the 'patterns' they made were for big machine tools. The pattern in the photo shows a lift-housing for a tractor – and Brierley still has the finished product on his tractor!

In the '70s, engineering in the area began to decline and most pattern-making moved to the motor industry in the Midlands but Brierley continued to work as a pattern maker until he retired in 1990. After he retired he sold the building and it became a house, the old pattern shop is used today as a garage and dwelling.

As an apprentice Brierley saw the whole process from making the initial pattern to finishing the final product. He said "you learn all your life" and is still making models and patterns. He is also still cycling, in 2014, when the Tour de France came through Cragg Vale, the record for the oldest and youngest participants in the cycle climb up the longest continuous hill in England was held by Brierley and his (then) 7year old grandson!
