Let's All Go to The Park

We love to explore the local area with the children - perhaps you've seen them in their waterproof outfits heading off to Forest School, or more recently, going to the park for an adventure.

A trip to the park can mean more for the children than playing on the swings and the slides. It helps with gross motor skill development as they climb, run and jump. Children who spend time playing outdoors are more likely to move in ways that challenge their muscles, bones and physical endurance.

Their sense of balance and co-ordination is tested as they play, catch balls or play hopscotch and their imaginations can run wild.

Children learn to love nature through their own experiences. They listen to birds singing, or the wind rustling through the trees. They can go on a bug hunt, smell flowers and splash in muddy puddles. Why not lie on your back and look for shapes in the cloud formations overhead?



The main news from St John's is that Cathy Reardon, our vicar, has retired after being in charge of the Erringden Benefice (the parishes of Cragg Vale and Mytholmroyd) for 10 years. She took her last service on July 23rd and has now moved, with her husband Alan, closer to family in Lancashire. Cathy has seen the two churches through reordering (St John's), floods (St Michael's), and the Covid pandemic and we are grateful to her and Alan for all they have done for both churches. We will miss them a lot.

We now start an 'Interregnum' (literally - the time between reigns) which will last until a new vicar is appointed. The process can take a while and is likely to last months rather than weeks. In the meantime, St John's is in the hands of the churchwardens and the Parochial Church Council (PCC). A HISTORY OF THE CRAGG VALE AREA

Glyn Lee, member of the Cragg Vale Local History Group, talks about his latest book, produced with help from Cragg Vale residents.

For the last 12 months I have been busy researching my latest Calderdale book 'A History of the Cragg Vale Area'.

During that time, I have enjoyed meeting some of Cragg Vale's residents who have kindly passed on their knowledge and, in many cases, their life-long experiences of living and working in Cragg Vale. In this respect I am greatly indebted to members of St. John's Tuesday Church Group for their contribution to my research and loaning me some of the photographs in the book. I particularly want to thank Mrs Doris Hirst for sharing her extensive knowledge of the area, who at ninety-four years young, has lived in Cragg vale all her life.

A History of Cragg Vale, illustrated throughout with old and new photographs, covers such topics as: Cragg Road, Erringden Deer Park, Coiners' Country, St. John's Church, The Industrial Scene, Inns and Beerhouses, Shops, Sports & Leisure, Cragg Vale Spa, Castle Hall Auxiliary Hospital and Walks Around Cragg vale. The chapter on Coiners' Country and Industrial Scene is discussed in some detail. I hope the book will appeal to anyone living in Cragg Vale who has an interest in local history. I have tried to portray some aspects of Cragg Vale's history and traditions which go back to at least medieval times. The book is only available to borrow or use for reference from Calderdale Libraries and there are several copies of the book at the Hebden Bridge, Sowerby Bridge and Halifax branch libraries for readers to use.

BROADHEAD CLOUGH **AUTUMN 2023**

We know that Broadhead Clough is a great place to visit, but due to its challenging climb, steep steps and uneven path it is designated as one of the Trust's "Wildest" reserves. During the summer we're pleased to report that a second bench has now been installed giving the opportunity for folk to have a rest before the final climb up on to Erringden Moor. The new bench is at the path junction- an ideal place for looking out over the sycamore bowl, and where the children's "Making Tracks: Nature walk" turns to the side gate exit.

This came about through a real community effort involving a grateful walker who was "rescued" from the hills by the local mountain rescue team; CROWS recommending the Clough as a popular location; and YWT providing a suitable site. Seven volunteers from Calder Valley Search and Rescue transported the bench up to site using their unicycle "stretcher". This proved ideal reconnaissance as they were called into action for real three days later when someone fell coming down the clough! The bench has been presented by local business British Recycled Plastic, (based at Topland Country Business Park) and has a dedication "with thanks to Calder Valley Search and Rescue team members and their search dogs".

During the summer we broke off from the dry stone walling to tackle the annual task of pulling bracken from the heath areas in the reserve. It's hard work, but every year the regrowth is definitely less and the stalks don't grow as thickly or as high so the bilberry can flourish. We always wear heavy gloves, as the stalks contain silica and can splinter, causing serious hand wounds. Also be very careful if you have to walk through thick bracken blocking a path. If wrapped across an ankle or snapped off it can result in lower leg /insect repellent depending on the weather. All tools wounds too. One way is to use a stick to bash aside, then stamp it flat to walk over, rather than try to push through.

The cattle have also returned to the YWT meadows and on the approach to the reserve. This year there is a mix of Highland cows with calves, and mixed commercial breeds. They can be nosey but are usually placid if you keep calm and guiet when passing. We will finish the dry stone walling on the September task day and in the autumn work on selective thinning of some tree species to improve floral diversity in the wood. Also in autumn, "Slow the Flow" will be installing leaky dams at Broadhead Clough on the third Sunday of the month, starting in September. 


